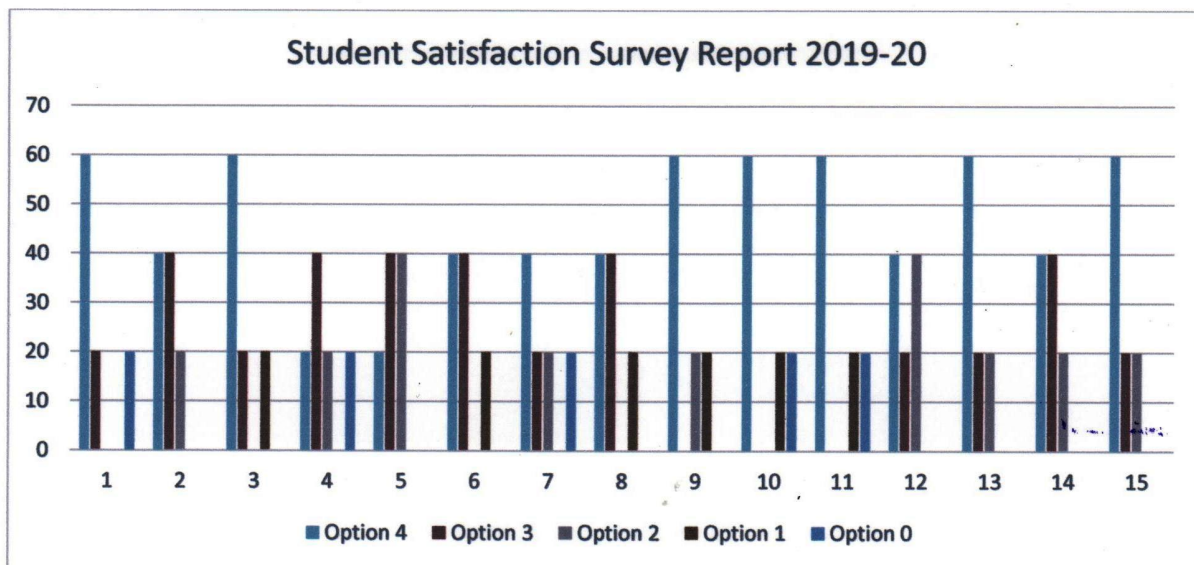

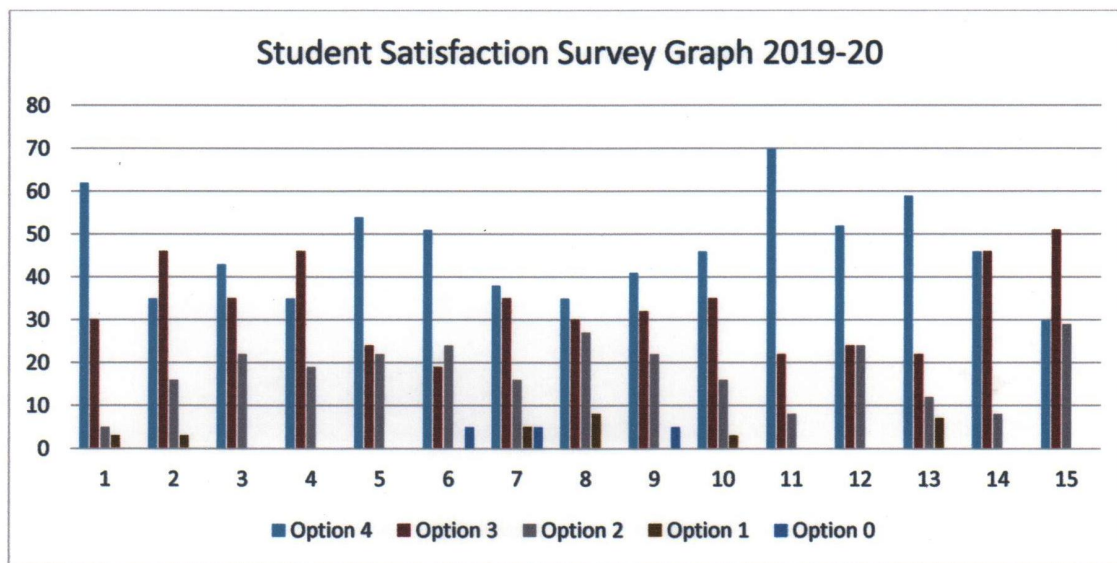
Remarks and Suggestions by Students

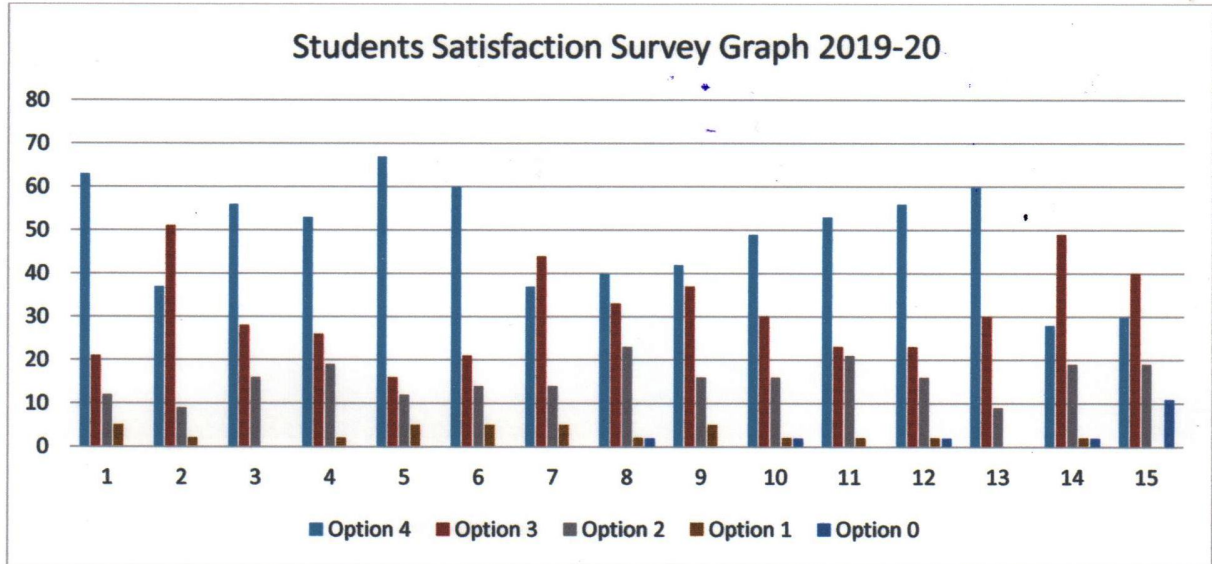

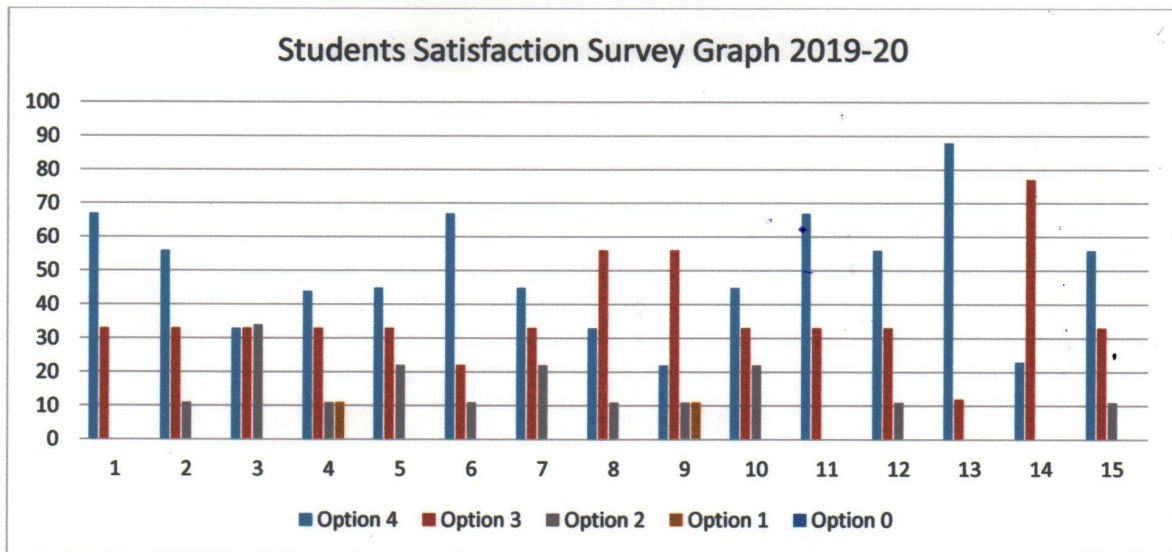

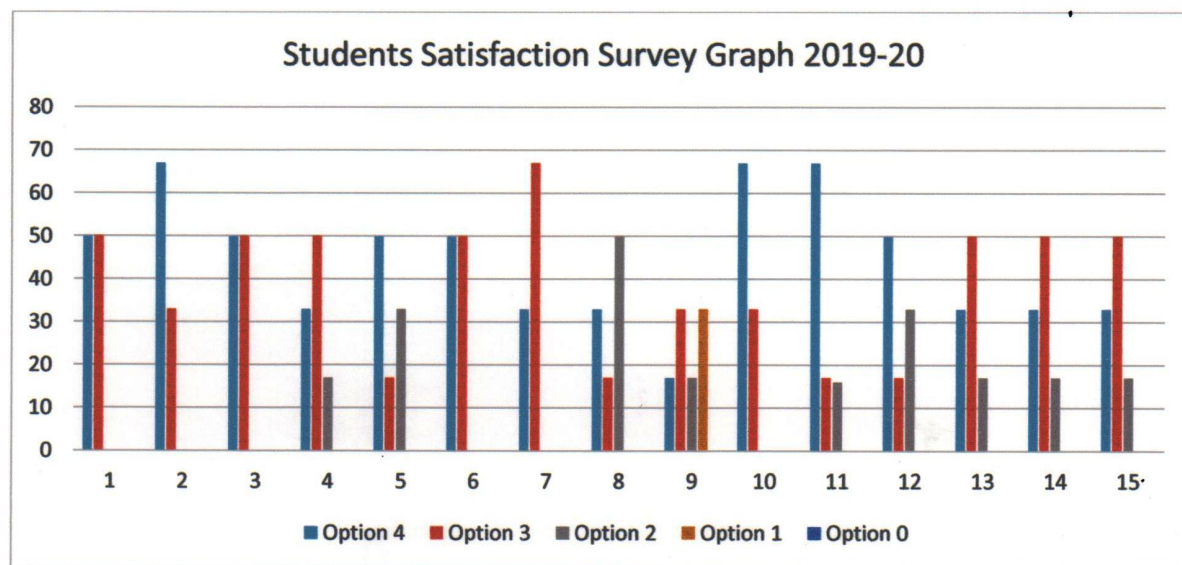

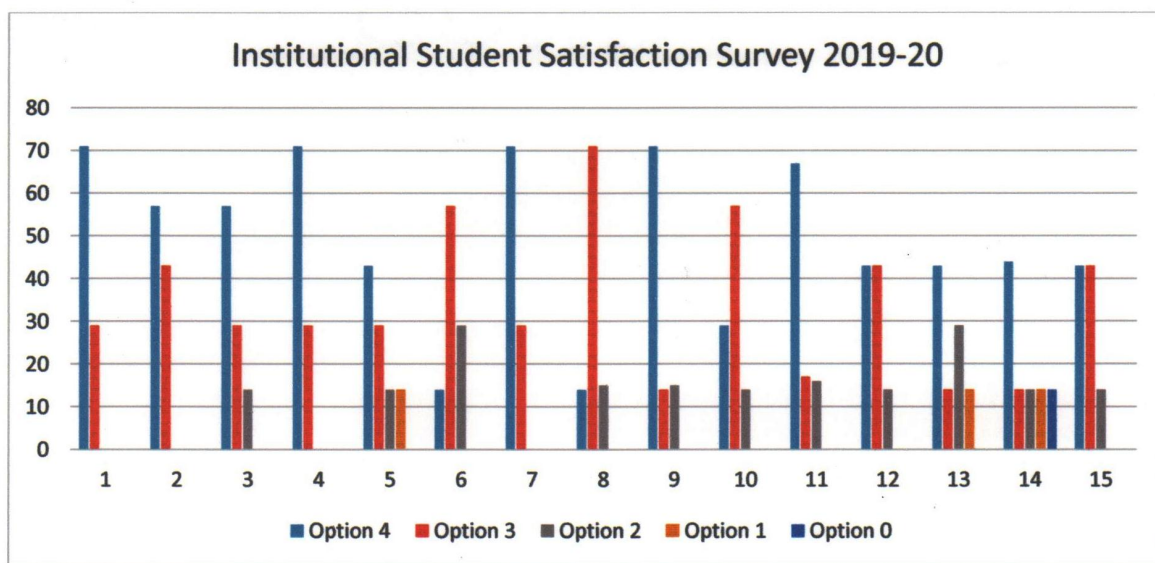


Remarks and Suggestions by Students
