Inaugural Session

Day One - 14th February 2020

The registration of all the participants was open till 12.00 on Friday, the 14th of February 2020. A total number of 115 Research Scholars from across the country have participated in the National Seminar. The inaugural session began with the lighting of the traditional lamp by the Guests to invoke the blessing of Saraswati, the Goddess of Knowledge and garlanding the portraits of Rashtrasant Tukadoji Maharaj and the founder of the Institution late Shri. Bhausaheb Govindrao Mulak followed by University song and welcome song by the volunteers of National Service Scheme. An introductory remark and welcome speech was made by the convener of the National Seminar, the Principal of the Institution Dr. Jobi George. The inaugural session was presided over by Dr. Rajendra Jane, Principal, College of Arts and Commerce, Bhisi. Shri Devaji Tofa, Adivasi Samaj Sevak (Adivasi Social Worker) Mendha, Lekha Gadchiroli spoke at length on the all-inclusiveness of Vasudeva Kautumbakam. The Research Papers were put to plagiarism check software and absolutely zero – tolerance to plagiarism was a decision taken by the organizers of the Seminar. The downloaded link and the 61 Research Papers were in the form of a CD, which was unveiled in the inaugural session by the distinguished Guests present on the dais.
