DETAILED REPORT OF THE ACTIVITY	<p>As per the orders and guidelines issued by the Supreme Court, Central and State Governments and the University Grant Commission, an Anti-ragging Cell, under the aegis of Internal Quality Assurance Cell, has been set up in our Institution. The Anti-ragging Cell of our Institution organized an Orientation Programme to prevent any untoward incident.</p> <p>The Institution, through its Anti-ragging Cell, adopts zero tolerance towards ragging and strictly complies with the policies and guidelines as notified by the authorities concerned. In order to create a sense of cooperation and empathy among the students and to prevent any student from becoming a victim to ragging, Anti-ragging Orientation</p>

Programme plays a crucial role in fostering a culture of respect, empathy and inclusion in the College Campus. By raising awareness, establishing support systems and promoting active participation, the Orientation contributed to creating a safer and more conducive learning environment for all the students of our College. The Anti-Ragging Cell of our Institution organized an Awareness Programme on 8th November, 2023 for the students to inform them about Anti-Ragging. Students were strictly instructed about anti-ragging and were informed of strict disciplinary actions if found guilty, as per the guidelines and policies of the Institution. Information on anti-ragging was posted on the Notice Board to create awareness among the students.

The Coordinator of the Programme and the Member Secretary of Anti-Ragging Cell Asst. Prof. Dr. Mangesh Kadu delivered the Introductory Speech. The introduction outlined the roles of the University Grants Commission, the Central and State Governments and the Directions of the Supreme Court regarding zero tolerance towards ragging. He further explained that ragging encompasses various forms of harassment, including verbal abuse, physical assault and coercion, often perpetrated

by seniors against newcomers. It thrives on power dynamics and the desire to assert dominance, creating an atmosphere of fear and intimidation, and the Anti-Ragging Cell of our College adopts zero tolerance towards the same. The Police Inspector of Bhiwapur Police Station Hon. Mr. Jaypalsing Girase, the Chief Guest, guided the students and asked them to create a sense of cooperation and empathy among the students and to prevent any student from falling victim to ragging. In his speech, he emphasized the significance of discipline and time in students' lives. He educated students about the legal provisions of the Indian Penal Code regarding anti-ragging. On this occasion, the Chairperson of the Programme and the Principal of our College, Dr. Jobi George, guided the students regarding anti-ragging and apprised them of the code of conduct.

Ragging, a form of bullying in Educational Institutions has long plagued Campuses worldwide, leading to physical, emotional, and psychological trauma of victims. Recognizing its detrimental effects, our Institution has implemented anti-ragging policies and Orientation to foster a safe and inclusive environment for the students, he added. Associate Prof. Dr. Sunil Shinde, Head, Department of Economics, was also present on
