<p>DETAILED REPORT OF THE ACTIVITY</p>	<p>A thought-provoking Guest Lecture on 'The Responsibility of Young Voters and Indian Democracy' was held on 1st April, 2024 for addressing the pivotal role of Youth in shaping the future of India. The lecture was delivered by Associate Prof. Dr. Lomesh Bawankule, an esteemed Political Analyst and advocate for Civic Engagement, which was attended by students and Faculty Members, emphasizing the crucial intersection of Youth's participation and Democratic Health in India.</p> <p>The Lecture began with an exploration of</p>

the Fundamental Principles of Democracy, highlighting the significance of voting as a cornerstone. The speaker emphasized that Democracy thrives when Citizens actively participate in the Electoral Process. In a Nation as diverse as India, the collective voice of its People, particularly the Youth, is essential for a Representative and Functional Democracy.

He further explained that India boasts one of the largest Youth populations in the world. This demographic dividend was underscored as both a tremendous opportunity and a significant responsibility. He elucidated those young voters, equipped with Education and Awareness, have the power to influence Policy and Governance by making informed choices. Their active participation is not merely a right but a duty to ensure the Nation's progress and uphold Democratic Values.

The Guest Lecture was followed by an Interactive Session where students posed insightful questions, reflecting their concerns and aspirations. Topics ranged from Electoral Reforms to strategies for increasing voter turnout among the Youth. The speaker's responses further enriched the

Technical issues, such as unreliable Internet connections or a lack of necessary equipment, disrupted the Guest Lecture.
IMPACT/OUTCOME ACHIEVED	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Students were educated about the Principles of Democracy, the importance of Voting, and how their participation shapes the future of the Nation. 2. By addressing Students directly, the Lecture encouraged greater Political Engagement among the Youth, fostering a sense of involvement in Democratic Processes. 3. Educating the students (Young Voters) about the impact of their vote leads to increased voter turnout in the Lok-Sabha Election.
