INTRODUCTION

The Internal Quality Assurance Cell of Bhiwapur Mahavidyalaya, which is constituted as per the Guidelines of National Assessment and Accreditation Council, adheres to all the Notifications and updates on sustenance of Quality Education by NAAC and strives to uphold them in its letter and spirit. In accordance with the Guidelines of National Assessment and Accreditation Council, Bhiwapur Mahavidyalaya formed Internal Quality Assurance Cell, which adheres to all the Notifications and updates on sustenance of Quality Education by NAAC and strives to uphold them in its letter and spirit. The Annual Report of Internal Quality Assurance Cell for the Academic Session 2020-2021 is as follows:

Curricular Aspects

The Institution's Perspective Plan has been prepared taking into account all the contexts and the Feedback received through stakeholders and Students' Satisfaction Survey and National Educational Policy 2020. The Institution's Continuous Internal Evaluation Mechanisms and co-curricular activities are planned and implemented as per its Academic Calendar, which is prepared by the Internal Quality Assurance Cell in conformity with the University's Academic Calendar.

The Institution through its online Induction Programme impressed upon the students about all the Academic Policies, Activities, Teaching-Learning and Evaluation strategies, Programme and Course Outcomes. The Examination Committee, after written intimation to the students and teachers about the time table schedule and other processes, conducted Unit Tests, Surprise Tests,

One Model Examination, and University Examinations in Online and Offline platforms. Students were awarded internal marks through their online submission of assignments and revision tests. Students participated in Awareness Programmes, Workshops, Seminars, Community services like distribution of food grains, sanitizers, masks and medicines during the COVID-19 Pandemic. The Institution celebrated National Voters Day for instilling Democratic Values on 25th January, 2021. Professional Ethics and Human values were instilled by organizing International Yoga Day on 21st June, 2020.

Career Oriented Programme/Skill Development Programme/One Student One Skill Programme (OSOSP) for the Session 2020-2021 are as follows:

- ✚ Certificate Course in Journalism in Marathi of 3 Months from 15/01/2021 till 16/04/2021 with 32 students enrolling for the Course.
- ✚ Certificate Course in Spoken English of 30 days from 22/01/2021 till 22/2/2021 with 303 students enrolling for the Course.

Teaching-Learning and Evaluation

The Institution identified Advanced Learners and Slow Learners during the admission process by preparing faculty wise merit list. Interactive Sessions, Quiz Competitions, Seminars and Group Discussions, Unit Tests, and Model Examinations were conducted for assessing their learning aptitude.

✚ **Action Taken Report**

Slow learners were provided with;

- a. Additional learning support through **Remedial Classes** under ‘**Student Support System**’.
- b. Worksheets and Handouts based on the learning levels were given on Google Classrooms and WhatsApp Group.
- c. ‘Bridge Courses’ were conducted on the commencement of the Academic Session.

Advanced Learners are encouraged to;

- a. Write Research Papers in Research Journals and College Magazine.
- b. Participate in various competitions.
- c. Avail open-access facility in the Library.
- d. Contribute their literary creations in the College Magazine.

Curricular and co-curricular activities of the Institution are developed to ensure students’ active participation in all the learning activities. These practices enabled them to explore, experience and invent to the best of their abilities. To abreast the teaching staff of the latest learning

methodologies, they are promoted to participate in Orientation Programmes, Refresher Courses, Short Term Courses and Training Programmes on ICT and FDPs.

The Experiential Learning practices were carried out by the students through On-line mode. Accordingly, lectures and laboratory experiments were developed so as to enable them to understand the principles, techniques and application of contextual theories through On-line mode. Home assignments were made. Students' active participation in Webinars, Expert Lectures and other On-line educational activities conducted by the Institution and other collaborative Institutions enabled them to improve their presentation skills and also enriched their team-work spirits. This participatory learning practice not only helped them to identify their potentials but also enabled them to choose their career. Students' active participation in all the co-curricular activities carried out through NSS, NCC and other Extension Committees provided them ample opportunities to demonstrate their talents and thus made them aware of their social commitments. Platforms like Moodle, Zoom, Google Classrooms and Google Meet for conducting online classes were utilized. Virtual Labs and models were created for demonstrating Practical. Subject related notes, educational You Tube videos, instructions and notifications given by the teachers and the authorities were communicated to the students through WhatsApp Groups. Unit Tests and Terminal Examinations were conducted through Google platforms, which ensured continuous assessment and feedback of the students.

E-Learning resources like lecture notes, references, handouts, question bank, teaching plans and topic-wise PPTs, subject related videos and Moodle Courses were uploaded on Google Classrooms and WhatsApp groups. Transparent and Continuous Internal Assessment Mechanism was implemented in the Institution for assessing students' progress throughout the programme schedule. As notified by R.T.M. Nagpur University in its Website, students are informed about the examination scheme and also about the internal marking pattern for bringing more transparency to the evaluation system.

The Feedback of teachers on students' overall performances was discussed during Staff Council Meetings and accordingly an Action Taken Report was generated. The Feedback of Students on Teachers and on the Institution was collected, analysed and Action Taken Report was generated and has been displayed on the Website. Students' Satisfaction Survey has been collected, analysed and Action Taken Report has been generated and displayed on the Institute's Website for the perusal of all the Stakeholders.

A transparent, time-bound and efficient mechanism to redress the Internal Examination related grievances of the students was in place. The COVID-19 Pandemic period witnessed many

discrepancies in the online mode of Internal Examinations and all these issues were redressed efficiently. Upon timely redressal, the students were informed about the same through WhatsApp groups, over phone and also via emails. Anomalies like lack of Network coverage and glitches in the University's Examination Portal were reported to the University resulting in re-examinations and corrections in the TR copy and also in the University's Gazette of results. Internal and External Examiners were appointed by the University to ensure more transparency, efficacy and credibility in the Internal Examination system.

The attainment of Programme Outcomes and Course Outcomes of our Institution have been reviewed through Students' progression in Higher Studies, their Results and their Placements.

40 Students are pursuing Post Graduate Studies in various disciplines. One student cleared Competitive Examination. One student got selected in the Indian Army and One student got placed in Punjab National Bank.

Research, Innovation and Extension

Our Institution supports Innovative Research Projects of staff by offering them all the requisite facilities in order to promote Innovations for creation and transfer of knowledge. One of the faculty members from Department of Chemistry Asst. Prof. Dr. Ashwini Kadu has been granted International Innovation Patent by Australian Government (IP Australia) on the topic "A Process for Preparing Medicine to Cure Kidney Stone" with Patent Number 2021103318 on dated 24 November 2021.

The Institution organized a total of 10 Seminars/ Webinars / Workshops in the academic Session 2020-21. The faculty of the Institution published 25 Research articles in Journals and 16 in Seminar / Conferences. Extension Activities

Infrastructure and Learning Resources

The classrooms were used by faculty during intermittent lifting of lockdown to reach out to students online. Expenditure for infrastructure augmentation excluding salary during the year (INR in Lakhs) was Rs. 4272730.38/-. Annual expenditure of purchase of books/e-books and subscription to journals/e-journals during the year (INR in Lakhs) was Rs. 165847/-

The total Number of Senior college students and teachers who visited the library in the 2020-2021 was 1520 in a total of 290 days of working including the lockdown period. A total of 858 faculty and students have recorded their footfalls which sums up to 56.45% use of library per day.

Class rooms are festooned with Interactive Board, Smart Boards, complete surveillance system, uninterrupted power back up with 25 KVA Generator, facility for high-speed communication links, anti-virus for all computers for the smooth delivery of all its programmes. Our Institution has 94 computers and 3 laptops. We have legal Libman Software for Library Management, CMS software for Office Management, Tally Software and Master Software's Software for Accounting, and ETNL Software for English Language Laboratory. The students – computer ratio amounts to 1:8 with a total of 836 students in the current session. The bandwidth of the internet connectivity is **≥ 50MBPS**.

A total of Rs. 34070/- expenditure was incurred on maintenance of infrastructure (Physical and academic support facilities) excluding salary component during the year. The Institution has established mechanisms for maintaining and utilizing various support facilities, which include laboratory, library, sports amenities, computers, classrooms and other facilities. Optimum allocation and utilization of existing and generated resources for the maintenance of various facilities was ensured as mentioned in the Annual Budget.

The 'Students' Grievance and Redressal Cell' addressed students' grievances especially issues related with University's examination through Digital Mode. 'Anti-Ragging Cell' of the Institution was active and even after the lifting of the lockdown restrictions and the resuming of the classes no untoward incident has been reported. Students have organized programmes like Lectures,

Workshops, Aids Awareness and De-addiction Rallies, Blood Donation Camps, Medical Check-up Camps, Tree Plantation Drives, Cleanliness Drives, Republic Day, Independence Day, 'Shramdaan' on Gandhi Jayanti, International Yoga Day, National Voters Day and NSS Pandharwada, Sports and Cultural Events. The Institution, in collaboration with NGOs, JCI, and alumni, has organized community services and these activities were carried out through Offline and Online Modes.

Bhiwapur Mahavidyalaya's Alumni Association is a registered body under Societies Registration Act, 1860. The Alumni assisted the Institution in organizing various curricular, co-curricular and extra-curricular activities by giving trainings to students in One Act Plays, Skits on various social issues, Drama, Dance and other Sports Items. The Alumni extended their olive hands in the form of groceries, cloth, medicines, masks and other essential items for distribution among the COVID-19 Pandemic affected people especially to the migrant labourers. During this period a wide range of Awareness Programmes on COVID-19 Protocols were conducted by our Institution with the support of Alumni on Virtual Platforms for the benefit of the students' community.

Governance, Leadership and Management

Some of the Strategies to achieve improvisations in the sustenance of Quality Education were decided as given below:

- Augmentation of Infrastructure
- Introduction of Add-on Courses / Value Added Courses / Self-financing Courses as part of Skill Development Initiative.
- Proposals sent to authorities concerned for obtaining their NOC for recruitment of teaching and non-teaching staff.
- Proposals to start Post graduate Courses and Research Centre in different disciplines.
- Improving collaborative activities and making MoUs functional.
- Empower students through Entrepreneurship Development Cell and Training and Placement Cell.
- To enhance and synchronize ICT enabled and Traditional Method for effective curriculum delivery.

As per the strategic plan of the Institution, the Courses under the Skill Development Initiative like Tally, Beauty Culture and 22 other courses under the flagship of One Student One Skill Programme (OSOSP) run by our Institute with affiliation of Rashtrasant Tukadoji Maharaj Nagpur University aim and function unceasingly for the empowerment of the students in making them

financially independent. A student named Chetna Jambhule (B.A. Part-1) and NSS volunteer who passed the Certificate Course in Fashion Design and Technology in the Academic Session 2019-2020 prepared masks for distribution among the poor people including the migrant labourers travelling via Bhiwapur town to their native places.

Internal Financial Audit and External Audit

Internal Financial Audit was done to keep track on the administrative expenses incurred during the Financial Year. The Audit includes financial transactions resulting from salary grants, non-salary grants, unaided courses, grants received from UGC and Scholarships.

External Audit which is conducted by an independent Finance Officer seated in the Joint Director's office. The Office of the Accountant General has a provision of looking into the Audited Statements submitted every five years.

Institutional Values and Best Practices

The Institution adheres to the guidelines of Statutory Bodies regarding the management of degradable and non-degradable waste. Notices to this effect were affixed on Notice Boards for educating our students. Waste management is managed by disposing off the e-waste and Solid Waste through proper mechanisms. The wet solid waste and dry solid waste are stored in red and green coloured Bins separately. Degradable waste like garden waste and canteen waste are collected and the vermicompost technique is used to fasten the pace of decomposing with the help of earthworms and cow dung.

Extension and Outreach Programmes

The volunteers of NSS and Fashion Designing Course prepared masks and distributed to the needy people during the COVID-19 Pandemic. With the contributions of staff, grocery kits were distributed to the poor people including the migrant labourers.

Cultural and Extension Activities

The Cultural Committee identified the regional cultures and planned activities accordingly to give wider exposure to students through dance, drama, and prevalent folk culture. On the eve of National Voter's Day, Voter's Awareness programme was organized in collaboration with the Tahsil office of Bhiwapur. The objective of the programme was to make the students aware of their duty and involvement as rightful citizens. It is a practice of the Institution to educate students

against the consumption tobacco, alcohol and drugs. The pledge on De-Addiction was given to the students on the eve of Independence Day. Service to Nation in the hour of need is the Core Value of the Institution and this value has been depicted from the stitching of PPE Kits, preparing masks for distribution and supplying groceries to the migrant labourers during Covid-19 pandemic. The Institution celebrated 29 commemorative days/events and festivals in the Academic Session 2020-2021 under the aegis of IQAC. We implemented all these activities by following the COVID-19 Protocols. Due to unavoidable circumstances the Death Anniversary of Shri. Lokmanya Tilak, which falls on 1st August was observed on 3rd August 2020. The Birth Anniversary of Dr. Sarvepalli Radhakrishnan was celebrated on 5th Sept. 2020. Gandhi Jayanti, which falls on 2nd October was observed on 3rd October 2020 due to some inconveniences. Though the Death Anniversary of Bharat Ratna Dr. Babasaheb Ambedkar falls on 6th December, we arranged the programme on 7th December, 2020.

Our Institution promotes the policy of earn and learn. We added courses like Mushroom Cultivation, Bamboo Craft, Handicraft, Fashion Designing and Tally and Accounting etc. to provide opportunities for skill development and value addition. Consistent in skill development, the Institution inspires students through One Student One Skill Programme (OSOSP). Out of the 17 courses designed, the students are free to choose One Skill Programme per Semester. Accordingly, many students completed Skill Training Programmes. The objective of OSOSP is to train students in Skills along with Academics. This mission of Skill enhancement was the outcome of NAAC sponsored National Seminar on 'Role of HEIs in Tapping Local Resources for Quality Sustenance and Quality Enhancement' in February, 2020. But due to the Pandemic and the demand of these courses to be in an offline mode, the course could not be run in this Session. Institution's thrust areas are its fulfillment of Vision and Mission, which entrusts the Institution to work towards the holistic development, employability and enhancement of skills for life.
