DETAILED REPORT OF THE ACTIVITY	The <i>School Connect Programme 2.0</i>, launched by the Government of Maharashtra, is a flagship initiative aimed at engaging students and fostering awareness about the various dimensions of National Education Policy (NEP) 2020. Targeted specifically the students from Grades 8 to 12 enrolled in Junior Colleges and Higher Secondary Schools across the state, the Programme seeks to build a strong foundation for the successful implementation of NEP-2020. In alignment with this state-wide initiative, our College, under the dynamic leadership of Principal Dr. Jobi George, proactively constituted dedicated teams comprising members of the teaching staff. PROBLEMS FACED, IF ANY	Challenges: Limited awareness and understanding of NEP-2020 • Many students, teachers, and even school administrators have had limited prior knowledge about the key features and long-term implications of NEP-2020. • Misconceptions or confusion about complex policy terms like ABC, CBCS, or multiple entry-exit options, have hampered clarity. Time Constraints • Coordinating visits during the academic calendar was a challenge due to on-going school schedules, exams, or other institutional activities. • Limited time slots available for Awareness Sessions reduced the depth and quality of interaction. Logistical Challenges • Organizing transport, coordinating with schools, ensuring attendance of students and staff, and managing schedules for over 20 faculty members involved significant logistical effort. • Ensuring uniformity in the delivery of information across multiple groups and schools was challenging for the Group Leaders. However, the Organizing Committee addressed these challenges through careful planning, effective communication, and contingency strategies which ensured the smooth execution of the Activity.

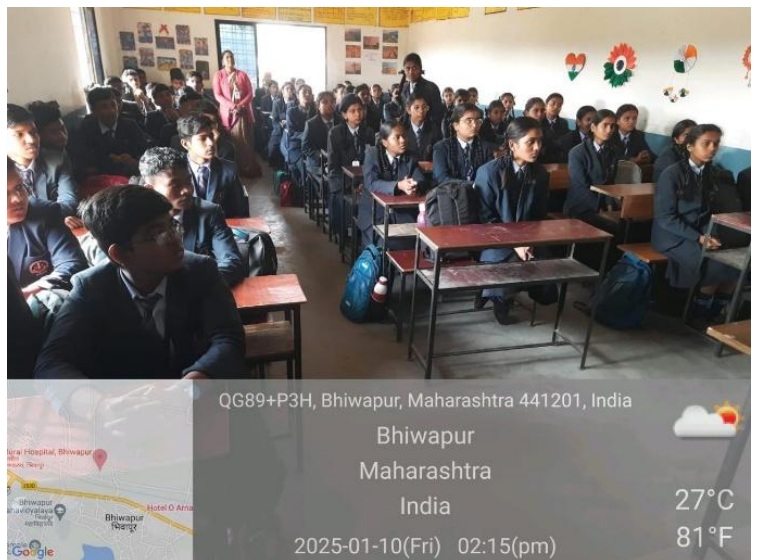
