DETAILED REPORT OF THE ACTIVITY	The Charitable services of the Founder President of our Institution Heavenly Shri. Bhausahab Govindrao Mulak has been a guiding force for us to carry forward the beacon of Charity. The inauguration of the voluntary donations in the Alms Boxes was organized under the aegis of ‘Swargiya Bhausahab Mulak Students’ Welfare and Community Service Centre’ in the Administrative Block of our College on 13th October, 2025. At the outset, Dr. Jobi George, the Principal of Bhiwapur Mahavidyalaya, Bhiwapur paid homage to the portrait of Heavenly Shri. Bhausahab Govindrao Mulak who pioneered the foundation of a new era in Higher Education in Vidarbha Region by establishing a Charitable Trust namely ‘Backward Class Youth Relief Committee’ (BCYRC) in 1974. The staff and the students of our College donated enormously in the Alms Box to donate to the needy people in the society. Utilizing the funds collected through voluntary donations, the ‘Committee for Extension Services’ of our College, organized a Free Notebook Distribution Programme for students of Zilla Parishad schools on 8th December, 2025 marking the birthday of Hon. Rajendra Mulak, former

	Minister of Maharashtra and the Secretary of Backward Class Youth Relief Committee (BCYRC). The Programme was conducted under the guidance of Dr. Jobi George, the Principal of our College, in collaboration with the Alumni Association of Bhiwapur Mahavidyalaya. A total of 200 notebooks were distributed to students from four schools in Bhiwapur: Zilla Parishad Main Primary School; Zilla Parishad Primary School, Dighora Ward; Zilla Parishad Primary School, Koshtipura; and Girls' High School. The Programme was graced by several distinguished guests, including Shri Dilip Gupta, President of Bhiwapur Taluka Congress Committee; Shri Lavaji Janbandhu, former Mayor; Mrs. Kuda Kangale, former Chairperson of the Panchayat Samiti; and Ward Members namely Mrs. Manjusha Samarth, Mrs. Kiran Nagriker, Mr. Nandu Pachbhai, and Mrs. Varsha Thakre. The Event was also attended by former Gram Panchayat Members Mrs. Rekha Nagpure, Mrs. Sangita Govardhan, Mr. Premnath Thakre, and Mrs. Vishakha Motghare. Mr. Sharad Mire, Secretary of the Alumni Association of our College, were also prominently present on the occasion. Among the faculty members Prof. Dr. Sunil Shinde, Prof. Dr. Madhukar Nandanwar, and Asst. Prof. Dnyaneshwar Kamdi marked their attendance. PROBLEMS FACED, IF ANY	1. Limited Financial Resources: Since the Programme was entirely funded through voluntary donations, the availability of funds was limited, restricting the number of beneficiaries. 2. Mobilizing Voluntary Contributions: Encouraging consistent participation from students and staff in the donation drive required continuous motivation and awareness. 3. Identification of Beneficiaries: Coordinating with school authorities to identify deserving students and ensure equitable distribution of notebooks required careful planning. 4. Scheduling and Coordination: Aligning the schedules of the College, participating schools, alumni members, and chief guests posed logistical challenges. 5. Transportation and Logistics: Transporting

	notebooks to different schools and ensuring timely distribution involved considerable logistical arrangements. 6. Community Outreach: Reaching all deserving students within the available resources remained a challenge due to the increasing demand for educational support. These challenges were effectively addressed through the collective efforts of the College administration, faculty members, students, alumni, and local community representatives, leading to the successful implementation of the Programme.
